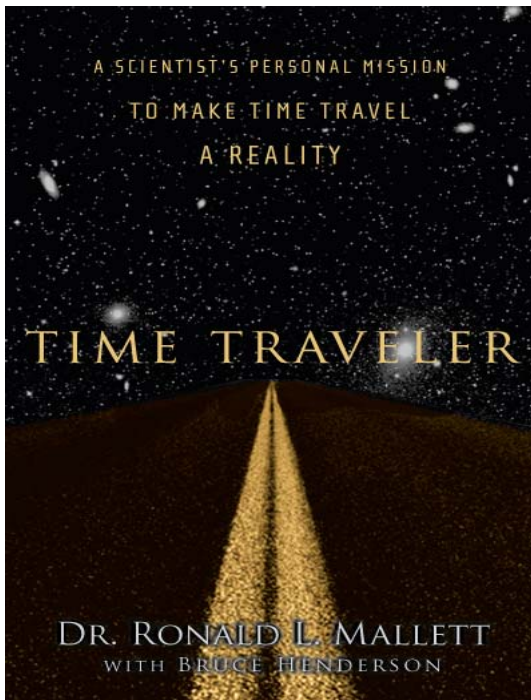

Time Traveler

A Scientist's Personal Mission to Make Time Travel a Reality



The oldest of four children, Ronald L. Mallett's life changed forever when his beloved father died of a heart attack. The ten-year-old was overwhelmed with grief—until he read a copy of *The Time Machine* by H.G. Wells. He was determined to make Wells' fantasy a reality by going back in time to see his father. Remarkably, not only did the boy from the Bronx stick with this vision, becoming one of the country's few African-American Ph.D.'s in theoretical physics—but Mallett has, according to many peers in the field, developed new theories relating to Einstein's general theory of relativity that plausibly argue for the existence of time travel into the past.

Combining elements of *Rocket Boys* and *Elegant Universe*, *Time Traveler* follows Mallett's discovery of Einstein's work on space-time, his study of Gödel's work on a solution of Einstein's equation that might allow for time travel, and his own research in theoretical physics spanning thirty years that culminated in his recent discovery of the effects of circulating laser light and its application to time travel.

Ronald L. Mallett, Ph.D., a professor of theoretical physics at the University of Connecticut, is a member of both the American Physical Society and the National Society of Black Physicists. He received his BS in physics in 1969, MS in 1970, and PhD in physics in 1973, all from Pennsylvania State University. He has published many papers on theoretical physics in professional journals. His time-travel research has been featured in an hour-long TV special on the Learning Channel, "The World's First Time Machine." He lives in Hartford, CT.
